



SOCIAL MEDIA GUIDELINES

This Parliament of South Australia is politically neutral, independent of any political parties/politicians and the work of the Government of South Australia. If you would like to engage in a discussion about politics, we recommend that you contact your local Member, or a Member of the Legislative Council.

The Parliament of South Australia's social media accounts are maintained and moderated by the Office of the Serjeant-at-Arms and the Usher of the Black Rod to provide you with accurate advice and to ensure compliance with these guidelines.

We encourage an open dialogue on our accounts, but we have the right to remove content and comments that compromise our politically neutral position. We also have the right to block users from our accounts for repeated violations of the page guidelines. Your comments may be pre-moderated or post-moderated based on the following guidelines:

- Comments must be relevant to the topic of the post.
- Do not use this page to advertise commercial products or activities.
- Do not use this page for political party advertising or election campaigns.
- Do not post comments that use abusive, threatening or contain inappropriate language.
- Do not post comments that are defamatory, harassing, discriminatory, obscene, incite violence, infringe copyright, condone illegal activities or are otherwise illegal.
- Do not spam or flood the comment sections.
- Do not post content that contains your personal information, such as phone numbers, email addresses or other contact information.
- Do not impersonate others or falsely claim to represent a person or organisation.

Please remember that content on social media is public; take note of your individual privacy settings before posting materials on our accounts.
