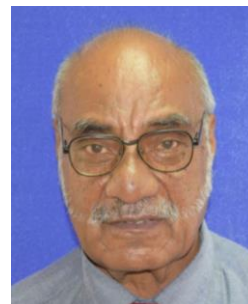

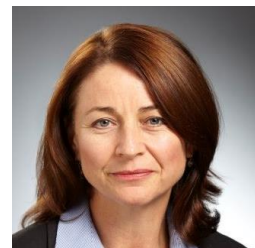

The Conference will commence with a Welcome Reception in the Old Chamber at Parliament House from **5pm – 6.30pm on Monday 18 November 2019**. Delegates to enter Parliament House through main central doors from North Terrace.

Formal conference sessions begin at **9.00am each day Tuesday to Thursday**. Tea and coffee is available from 8.30am each morning of the Conference.

A site visit of local urbanisation projects has been arranged on Wednesday afternoon. The bus will depart from Parliament House, Adelaide at 12.00 noon. Lunch will be included as part of the visit.

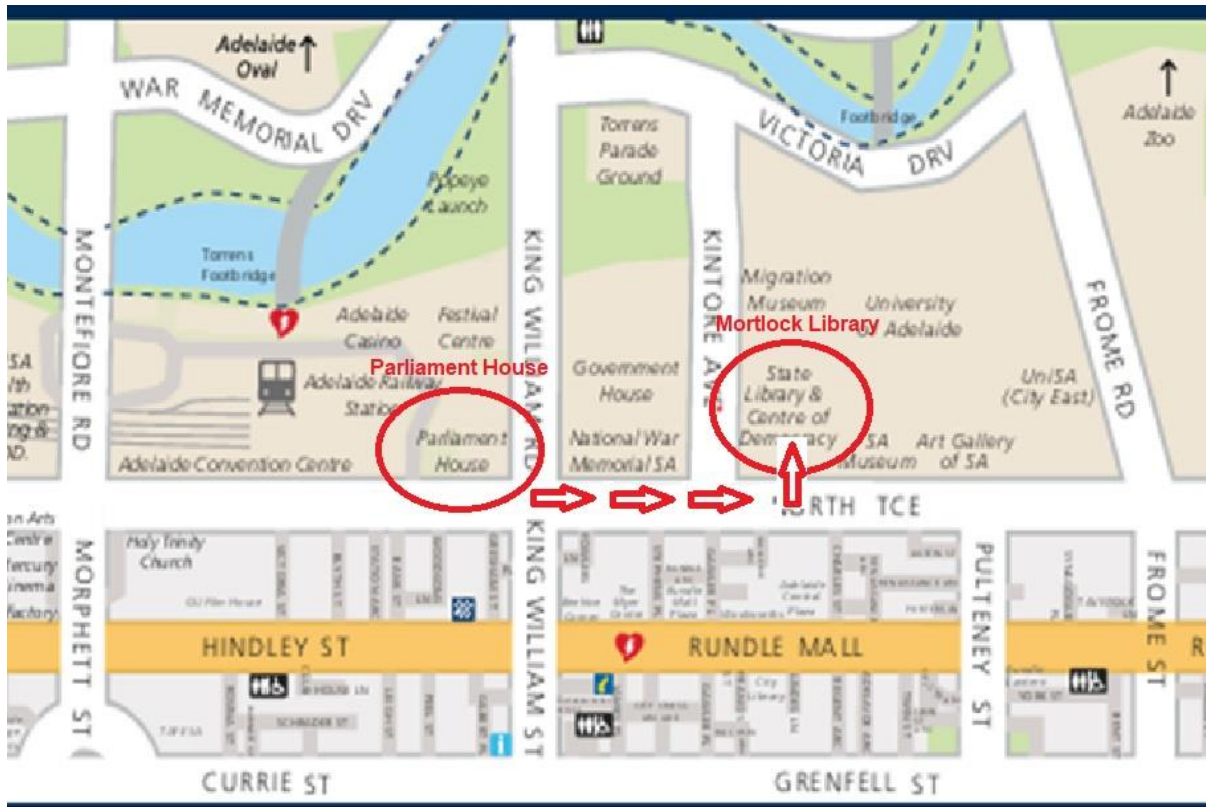

Mortlock Library



The interior of the Mortlock Wing is unique in South Australia and considered without equal as a mid Victorian public library interior in Australia. There are two galleries, the first supported by masonry columns, and the second by cast iron brackets. The balconies feature wrought iron balustrading ornamented with gold while the glass-domed lantern roof or clerestory allows the chamber to be lit with natural light.

The Mortlock Wing is regularly included on lists of the world's most beautiful libraries, and on travel blogs, and is a significant tourist attraction in South Australia.



Bowden



Bowden is the State Government's first higher density urban infill project. Located 2.5 kilometres from Adelaide's CBD on 16 hectares of land bordered by parklands, the project sets new standards in urban renewal.

Bowden is becoming an exciting integration of contemporary building and design innovation, adding to an already established community rich in culture and heritage.

The precinct's earthy and gritty character is reflected through the use of unfinished and recycled materials complemented by a natural colour palette for buildings and streetscapes.

Bowden's heritage of a once-thriving mixed use community is returning with the first residents now living in their new homes. The site is re-emerging as a place that's once again full of life and action. Its new streets are designed for pedestrians and bikes, with green open spaces and parks and easy access to public transport and other amenities.

The Bowden precinct is designed to be a safe, walkable urban neighbourhood a stone's throw from the city. It provides energy efficient housing, affordable housing, and fosters a strong, diverse community.

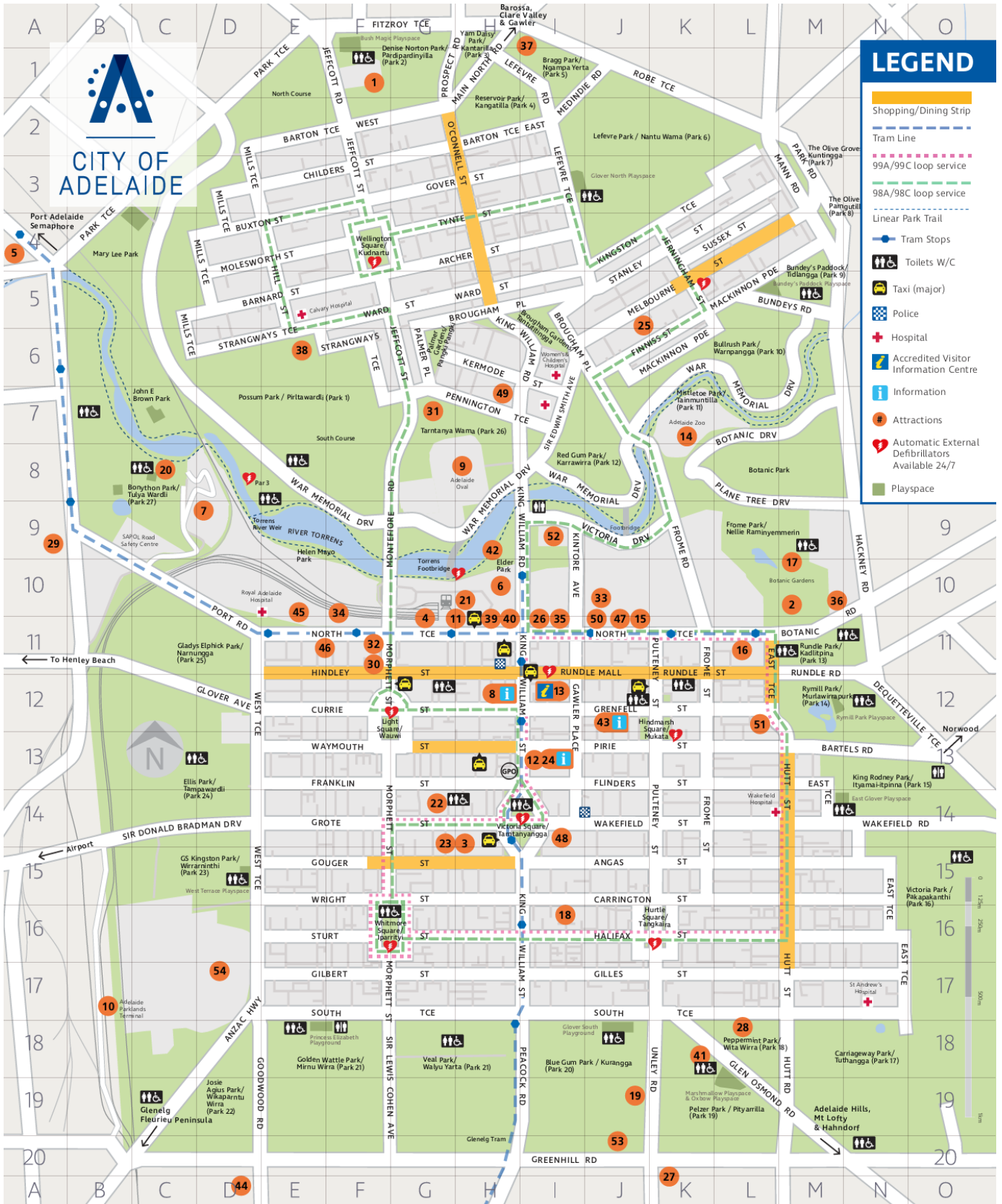
