



Terms of Reference (c)

1. Availability and Supply

Through licenced vendors both online and B@M stores which allow persons in regional and rural areas access to products. This also allows comparisons in pricing, quality and stock held.

Licencing should be a small admin fee, not a revenue stream for government departments.

2. Sale to Minors

I fully support an age restriction of eighteen plus. Vendors I have visited self-regulate on this anyway.

3. Advertising and Promotion

I feel broadcast media advertising is not necessary but vendors may feel otherwise.

These products should not have to be hidden away behind closed doors. Many consumers come into stores not knowing product by name. Very difficult for staff to continuously open and close doors for browsing customers. Why hide away non tobacco items? This is not tobacco!

4. Use in Smoke-free Areas

I agree should not be used in smoke free areas but requires allowance for Vape stores for sampling reasons.

5. Product Safety and Quality Control

These products (hardware) seem to be reasonably safe and reliable.

There is probable cause for testing documentation and certification of e-juices with minimum standards for manufacturing procedures and premises.
